program note

in 1925, a Kentucky cave explorer named Floyd Collins became trapped in Sand Cave while working to enlarge its passages in an effort to attract tourists to its wonders. Collins spent 14 days trapped under rock before succumbing to thirst, hunger, and hypothermia. “a cave no more the cave is” is an exploration of the mental and physical state of a man on the brink of death. as he bargains and prays for more time, the cave, the treasure that would have made his family rich, haunts and erodes his mind and body until he must face the inevitability of passing on.

performance notes

for electronics:

this work requires a two-channel setup and the composer's Max/MSP application.

use of the application in performance requires advancing of cues (with the spacebar or an external footswitch) and (minimal) monitoring/adjusting of the in-application mixer. this can be performed by the singer or a separate person. cues, marked numerically in the score, are always to be advanced on the downbeat of the measure.

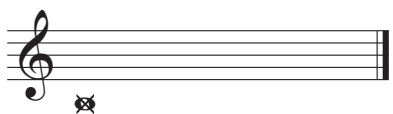
for performer:



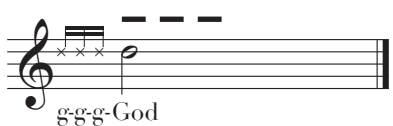
a rectangular notehead with feather beaming denotes shivering and teeth chattering and the speed at which it is performed.



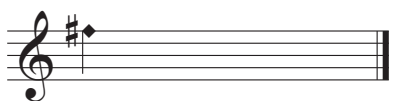
an x-shaped notehead denotes spoken text.



a regular notehead with an X through it and below the staff denotes a glottal fry (pitched as low as possible). this sometimes appears as a grace note slurred to a pitched note.



grace notes with x-shaped noteheads denote a shivering stutter. dashed lines above a note indicate sudden glottal stops; short silences breaking up the note.



a diamond-shaped notehead denotes an immediate shift to falsetto/head voice, à la yodeling.



an x-shaped notehead enclosed in parentheses denotes whispered text.



a large X in the place of a time signature denotes unmetered/spatial notation. the text given in this section is to be paced slowly at the performer's discretion.

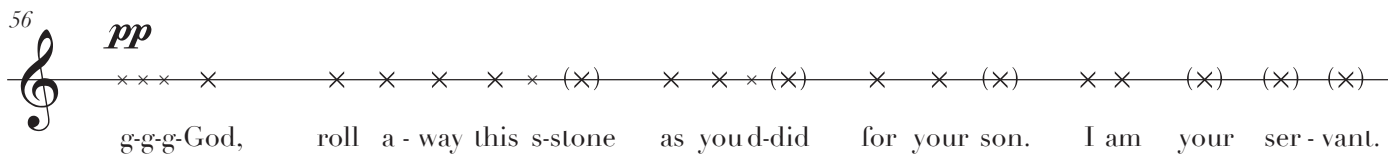

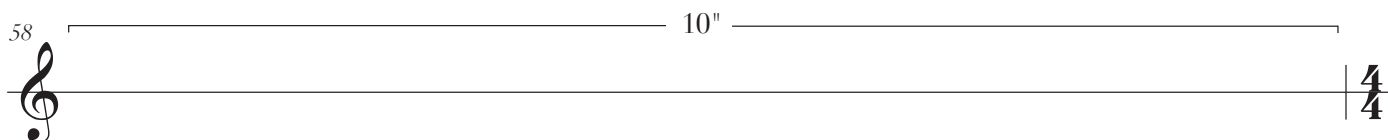
